# The Phenomenon of Apollonius of Tyana



**T**he contact of the human brain with events that occur in another distant space, at the same time has been proven historically and scientifically, in many cases. We will refer to two absolutely authentic events with communication at a distance.

The first took place in antiquity and had as its hero the famous philosopher and magician Apollonius of Tyanea. In many cases, the Tyanean had amazed the world, referring to events that took place at a great distance from the country in which he lived.

A shocking event that occurred in Rome was the murder of the emperor Domitian, and Apollonius saw it vividly, although he was in Ephesus and was giving a speech at the gardens of the Xystae.

Apollonius suddenly sensed that he was losing his voice, a shiver seized him abruptly, and he confused his words, precisely as happens to those people who lose their sense of the place in which they live and move.

At one point he looked at the ground with dazed eyes, took a few steps and shouted: "Strike the tyrant!"

## Insight

In the view of Goethe, insight comes from the depths of human existence, a developed revelation.

This insight is not related to external knowledge, but it is related to external factors and influences.

This insight has to do with the intellect of the individual, but mainly with his unchecked instinct and his distinct gifts.

Bergson argues that science can not capture the reality, movement, duration, creative development and flow of human experiences, which are the essence of life and the world.

The intellect produces thoughts and arguments related to reality as the world unfolds them before our senses.

However, insight, while it is related to the senses, is at the same time independent and can capture images, symbols and events outside the meaning of past, present and future times.

This insight is an activity of the subconscious and is a participation in the eternal things which, while they are around us and occupy the entirety of space, cannot be apprehended by the senses.

On the ontological level, insight is a transcendent state of mind, sometimes achieved through meditation and in particular by reducing the activity of our sensory organs.

The people of Ephesus stood astonished and speechless before the weird behavior of the speaker who was standing squarely in front of them making abrupt movements, and they awaited the outcome of the event.

At length, he raised his hands high and shouted: "Ephesians, take courage. The tyrant was killed today. What am I saying? Today? By Athena, he was killed now... just before I stopped my speech."

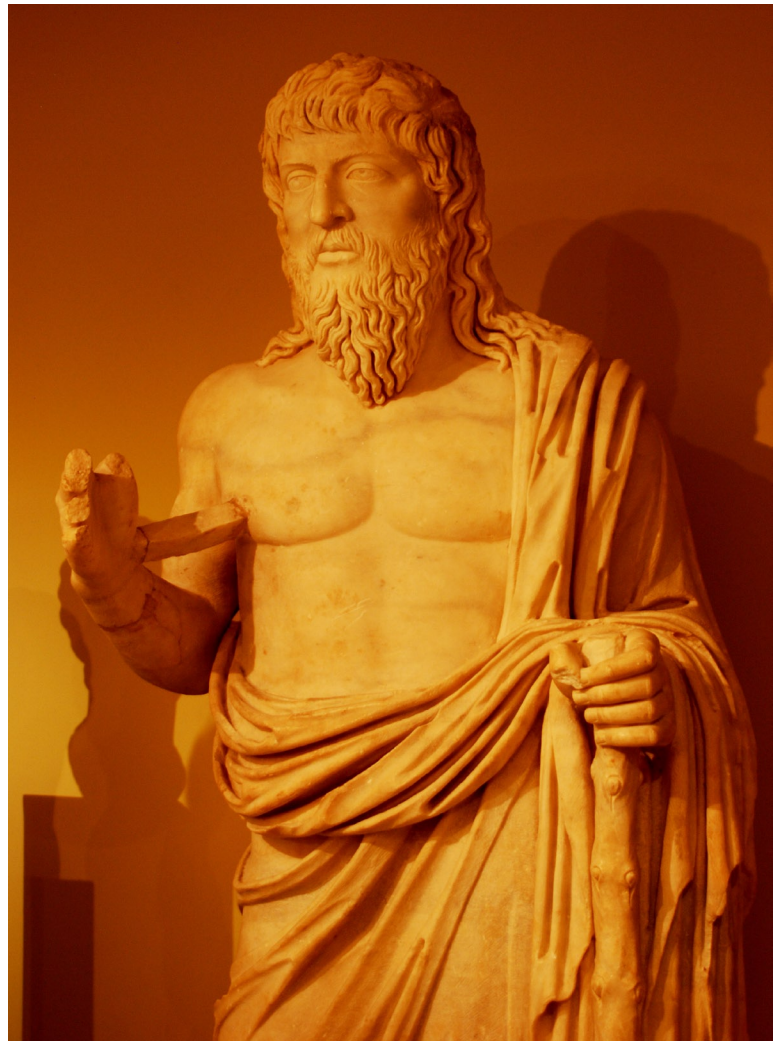


When on the following days the heralds arrived and declared the execution of the emperor Domitian, the day and hour that Apollonius mentioned the event, the Ephesians were astounded.
